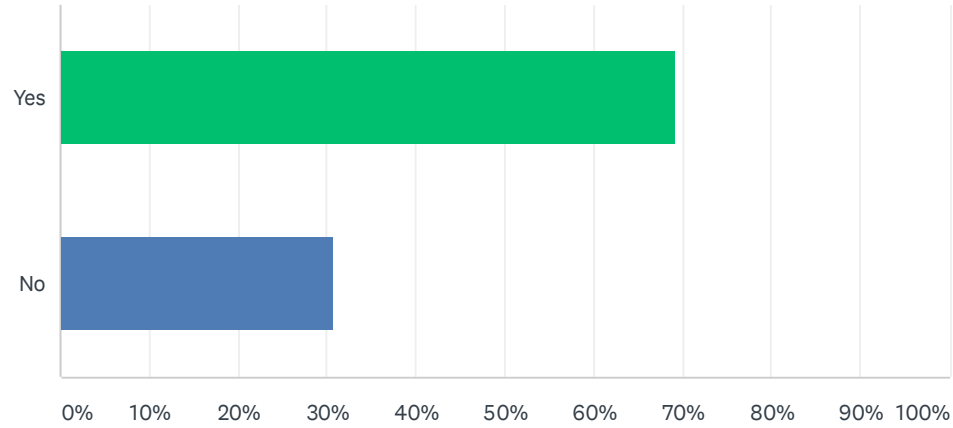


Q1 Did you know that there is a weekly OPNFV release meeting (Mon, 7 a.m. Pacific)?

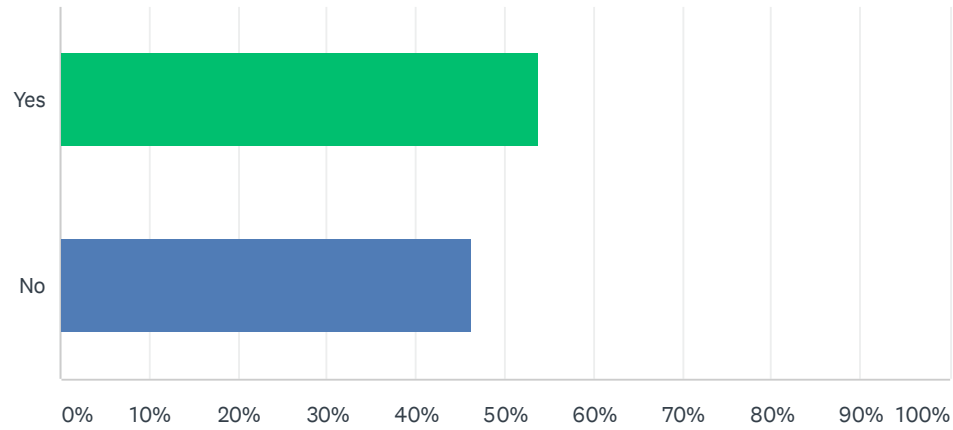

Q2 Have you ever attended an OPNFV release meeting?

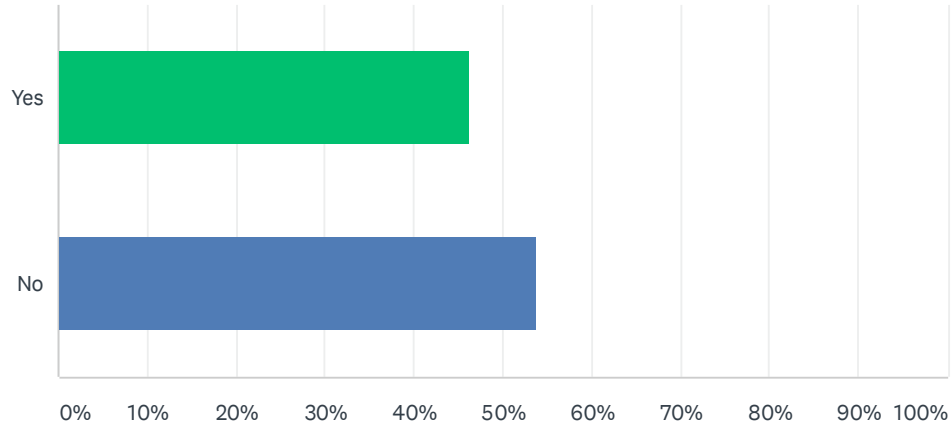

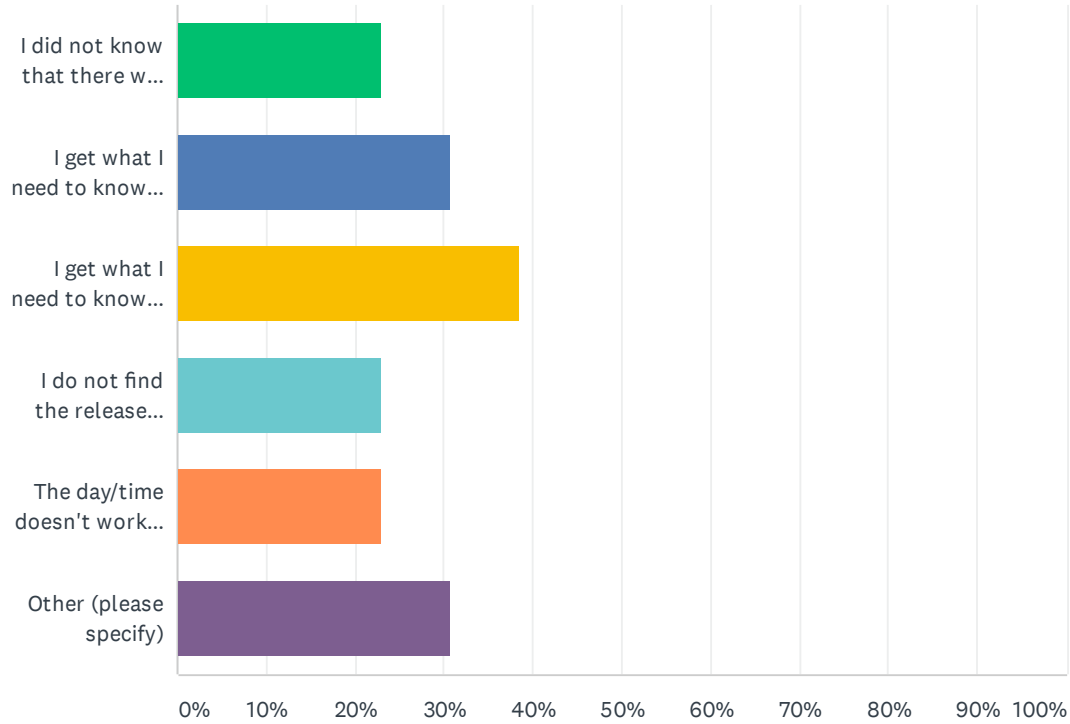

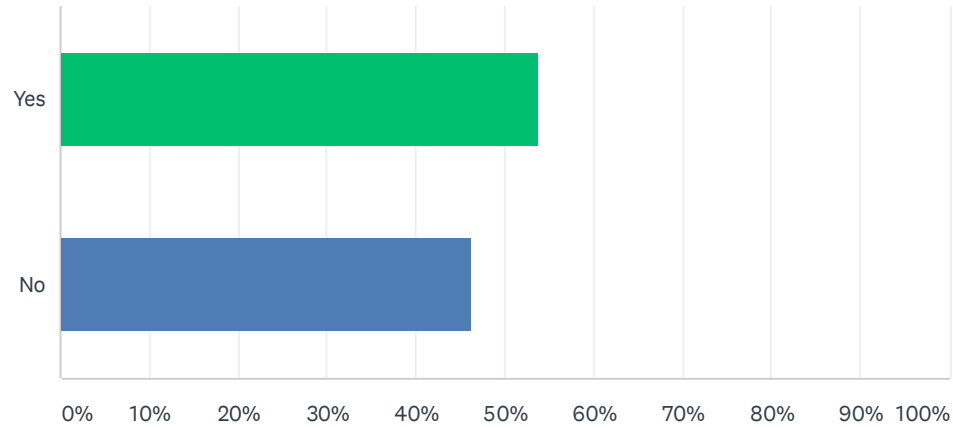
