

How to run Anuket releases without a release manager

- Anuket resources are very thin so hard to get anyone to work on the project
- Review of the project within Anuket – Some do not need release managers (Thoth), Some are not active, Some need releases (Functest, VinePerf, CIRV, Kuberef) and finally the reference docs.
- TSC could serve as a release manager with a stronger community
- We should support projects which do not follow the Anuket release model
- There are different categories of the projects
 - Projects that do not need releases (Thoth)
 - Inactive projects should just be archived
 - Reference docs – need minimal release support (set dates and gather requirements)
 - Set the dates for the release - TSC
 - Release plan - sub-project teams/PTL
 - Release tags in Jira and GitHub - TSC
 - Associate Issues with the GitHub project plan - PTL
 - Proofreading - PTL
 - Release branch creation - TSC
 - Readthedocs branch creation - TSC
 - Sub-project release highlights - PTL
 - Blogpost, release announcement - TSC
 - Test projects
 - Set the dates for the release - TSC
 - Release plan - sub-project teams/PTL
 - Release tags in Jira and GitHub - TSC
 - Associate Issues with the GitHub project plan - PTL
 - Documentation done - PTL/Team
 - Keep two releases per year
 - Update the release framework tasks with the slimmed down version
